








138th COUNCIL SESSION WCO 24th JUNE 2021



M. AJIT KUMAR CHAIRMAN (CBIC)



Chairman CBIC spoke about the key components of India's successful response to supply chain disruptions caused by the pandemic. By leveraging its IT strength, and introduction of initiatives such as Turant Customs, it removed geographical barriers for faceless & contactless assessment. The introduction of paperless processes and increased AEO participation in trade encouraged the rebuilding of trade volumes.



The 44th GST Council Meeting was conducted under the Chairmanship of Union Finance & Corporate Affairs Smt. Nirmala Minister through video Sitharaman conferencing. The Council in its meeting decided to reduce the GST rates on the specified items being used in Covid-19 relief and management till 30th September 2021.


CBIC KEY INITIATIVES

Revamping of the Quality Assurance Review System for evaluating the quality of audits

The Directorate General of Audit out evaluation of the carries performance of audits conducted by the CGST Audit Commissionerates on Qualitative and **Ouantitative** parameters. The **Qualitative** parameters are evaluated through Quality Assurance Review (QAR) mechanism. The Directorate General Quantitative evaluates also performance through the Audit Performance Index (API) mechanism.

Hitherto, the QAR was conducted by the Zonal units as per the provisions of 'Manual for Quality Assurance Review, 2016'. The provisions of the Manual were consonant with the provisions of Central Excise and Service Tax Audit Manual, 2015 (CESTAM).

However, in view of implementation of GST, the old QAR system of review of performance of Audit Commissionerate by the Zonal units needed to be restructured in accordance with the provisions of the CGST Act, 2017 and the GST Audit Manual, 2019.



Thus, the Directorate General of Audit has come up with an exhaustive manual in the form of 'Manual for Quality Assurance Review (QAR) and Audit Performance Index (API), 2021' by incorporating provisions of CGST Act, 2017.

manual lays down The methodology for conducting QAR of the audit performance of the CGST Audit Commissionerate bv the officers of Zonal units of the DG Audit in accordance with the provisions of GST Audit 2019, which Manual. are consonant with the provisions of CGST laws.

The Manual also provides for evaluation of Quantitative performance, viz. detection, recoveries of audit etc. of the field formations through Audit Performance Index (API) and lays down method of adjudging them by way of their All India Ranking.

CUSTOMS SEIZURES

JODHPUR CUSTOMS

On 17th June, Jodhpur Customs officers examined the baggage of a passenger arriving from Dubai and seized approximately 351 grams of gold-plated rhodium with an estimated value of INR 17.23 Lakhs. The rhodium was concealed in wire and other forms in trolley bags and other items.




SHILLONG CUSTOMS

In a joint operation of Customs Officers of Mizoram and 8 Assam Rifles on 5th June, 410 grams of Heroin was seized, at Balukai valley on the bank of river Tiau. The estimated worth of the seized Heroin was INR 1.64 Cr.

DELHI CUSTOMS

The Delhi Airport Customs arrested an Indian passenger on 1st June for smuggling 2 metal rods of gold weighing 1428 grams. The passenger arrived from Riyadh via Dubai by Emirates flight EK 510 and carried the gold concealed inside the check-in bag. The estimated value of the gold is INR 64.75 Lakhs.





The Delhi Airport Customs arrested two Afghan nationals under the NDPS Act on 4th June. They arrived by Emirates flight EK 516 from Dubai carrying 19.48 kg of black viscous liquid substance appearing to be Heroin which was concealed inside shampoo and hair color bottles. The estimated worth of Heroin is INR 136 Crore.

On 3rd June, SIIB, ACC Export Commissionerate, seized 367 iPhones of various models having market value of INR 3.19 Crore. These goods were misdeclared as household goods from Riyadh. On a similar note, on 5th June, 222 iPhones of various models, 173 used laptops, 4391 bottles of food supplements, 10 Sony PS-5 & cosmetics were seized. The estimated market value of all the goods was approximately INR 2.50 Crore.

DELHI CUSTOMS



Delhi Customs arrested a British national who arrived from Kabul by Ariana flight FG311 on 7th June. The passenger was arrested for smuggling 751 grams of gold jewelry in the checkin baggage. The estimated value of the seized gold was INR 29.88 Lakhs.

The Delhi Airport Customs arrested a Tanzanian national who arrived from Durba via Doha for smuggling 4.05 kilograms of brown sugar substance suspected to be Heroin.

On 13th June a Passenger travelling by Qatar Airways flight QR 1368, was arrested carrying Heroin of estimated value of INR 28 Crore, concealed inside cavities made in handbag and trolley bags.





The ACC Export Commissionerate seized 10 unregistered parcels destined to Hong Kong containing peacock feathers weighing approximately 8 kilograms at Foreign Post Office, New Delhi.

Customs (Preventive) intercepted 5 passengers arriving from Sharjah on 16th June. A total of 2.24 lakhs sticks of foreignorigin cigarettes valued at around INR 45 lakhs were recovered and seized.



DELHI CUSTOMS



Delhi Customs arrested an Indian passenger who arrived from Dubai by Emirates flight EK 516 on 23rd June for smuggling 1399 grams of gold. The gold was concealed in a mixer grinder and was estimated to be worth INR 62.68 Lakhs.

On 25th June, in multiple operations, 141 kilograms of Sandalwood (Santalum album) was prevented from being illegally exported and seized. Much sought after abroad, export of blocks/billets of Sandalwood is prohibited.



Delhi Airport Customs arrested two South African passengers who arrived from Johannesburg via Doha by Qatar Airways by flight QR578 on 26th June for smuggling 18 kilograms of white powder substance suspected to be Heroin which was concealed inside trolley bags. The estimated value of Heroin is INR 126 Crore.



VARANASI & LUCKNOW CUSTOMS



Customs at LBSI Airport Varanasi seized gold weighing at 239.650 grams on 7th June. The passenger arrived from Sharjah in Air India flight IX 184 and concealed the gold in the form of paste in his undergarments. The estimated worth of the seized gold is INR 11.98 Lakhs.

Customs at CCSI Airport Lucknow seized 100 Gold wire cut pieces having net weight of 706 grams and valued at INR 35.65 Lakhs from a passenger coming from Dubai in Air India flight IX-0194 on 8th June. The Gold wires covered with M-seal and aluminum foil was concealed in the artificial jewelry set.





Similarly, on 13th June, Customs seized Gold bars weighing 2.3 kilograms and valued at INR 117.66 Lakhs from a passenger coming from Riyadh in Indigo flight 6E-5424. Four Gold bars wrapped in black colored cello tape & carbon paper and concealed in a transformer.

On 22nd June, Lucknow Customs seized gold weighing at 814.500 grams and valued at INR 40.15 Lakhs from a passenger coming from Dubai in Air India Express flight IX 194. The gold in form of element was concealed in an iron box.





Customs (Preventive) Division, Varanasi with the help of GRP officers of Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhyay Junction seized four pieces of foreign-origin gold and gold jewelry total weighing 6064.7 grams and valued at INR 2.6 Crore from two passengers travelling from Hijli to New Delhi in train no 02825.

Customs LBSI Airport Varanasi seized foreign-origin gold weighing 465.9 grams valued at INR 22.83 Lakh from a passenger arriving from Sharjah in Air India Express flight IX 184. The two circular shape gold disk were concealed as part of grease gun and incense burner.

CHENNAI CUSTOMS



The Chennai Air Customs seized 140 gram of gold on 1st June. The passenger arrived from Doha and concealed the three gold bars inside his socks. The estimated worth of the gold bars is INR 7.14 Lakh.





On 4th June, the Chennai Air Customs seized 9.87 kilogram of Heroin worth INR 70 Crore seized from two African lady passengers who arrived from Johannesburg via Doha by Qatar Airways flight QR 528. The Heroin was concealed in their stroller bags. Both have been arrested under NDPS Act.

In a similar incident, on 10th June, the Customs officials seized and arrested a passenger carrying 1.25 kilograms of gold valued at INR 63.20 Lakhs. The passenger arrived by flight FZ 8517 from Dubai. It was concealed in the form of gold paste packets, stitched inside waist belt and ankle portion of jeans.

Chennai Air Customs seized 105 MDMA tablets worth INR 5.25 Lakhs under NDPS Act 1985, from two postal parcels which arrived from Netherlands & France at Foreign Post Office Chennai on 30th June.

COCHIN CUSTOMS

On 7th June, Calicut AIU seized approximately 511 grams of a compound gold from a passenger who arrived in Air India Express flight IX 354 from Sharjah. On 9th June, Calicut AIU again seized approximately 1.7 kilograms of a gold compound from three passengers who arrived in Air India Express flight IX 354 from Sharjah. The Gold compound was concealed as capsules inside the body of the passengers.

On 1st June, the Customs Preventive Team in a joint operation with DRI seized 3.3 kilograms of gold plates from three passengers. They arrived from Jeddah via Sharjah by Air Arabia flight G9 454. The hold plates were concealed inside battery cases of emergency lights.



On 12th June, AIU Kannur intercepted a passenger who arrived on Air India Express flight IX 350 from Muscat and recovered 1867 grams of 24 carat gold in the form of cut plates concealed inside the battery of an emergency lamp.

GOA CUSTOMS



Customs seized 11 gold bars collectively weighing 1.276 kilograms at Dabolim Airport on 4th June. The gold bars were concealed in the check-in baggage of a passenger arriving from Sharjah.

HYDERABAD DRI/CUSTOMS


Hyderabad DRI booked two cases for smuggling of 11.95 kilograms of Heroin against two passengers on 6th June. The passengers arrived from Doha and the powdered Heroin was concealed in the inner compartment of specially designed suitcases. The estimated worth of Heroin was INR 78 Crores.

Hyderabad Customs booked a case for smuggling of gold against a passenger on 7th June. The passenger arrived from Kuwait by Indigo flight 6E 8268. The passenger was smuggling 202 grams of 21 carat gold jewelry concealed by silver coating. The estimated value of the gold was INR 8 Lakhs.





On 23rd June, Hyderabad Customs booked a case for smuggling of iPhones against two passengers arrived by Air Arabia flight G9 458 from Sharjah. About 80 iPhones valued at INR 1 Crore were seized.


